APIARY NOTES



Most of you will now have taken your honey off and started varroa treatment, if necessary. A warning here. I have recently been shown a frame of brood from which all the bees hatching had shrunken and deformed wings caused by a virus. There were lots of varroa present. This same colony had previously been strong and produced lots of honey. The most likely cause is the robbing of a failing colony, possibly in the wild. Every trip the bees make can then bring back more varroa.

After treatment we then need to assess stores for the winter. You are looking for about 20kg (say 40lb) of stores. A National brood frame holds 5lb, a super frame holds 3lb, Commercial, Langstroth and 14x12 brood frames hold about 6-7lb.

We will have a stall to sell our honey and other produce at Brogdale and I will again be giving bee talks. We need volunteers to man the stall. Last time there was a lot of interest from the public and we sold lots of our honey so make sure you get some ready. We also need to get a banner designed and made and develop some good leaflets for people. If you want advice about preparing and labelling honey for sale do ask. It's fairly straightforward but the starting point is to ensure your honey is clean through straining when you extract.
