Management suite**

## **DIRECTIONS Whitefriars Conference room Canterbury.**

Free parking in the multi-storey car park. Collect your ticket and this will be processed during the meeting. Park on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor on the left and take the corridor down to the management suite at the bottom of the corridor on the left. Please car share however since Whitefriars have to pay the cost of this on our behalf.

**By car** Set Sat Nav post code to CT1 2TF

Go around the ring road and at the roundabout opposite the Police Station turn through the city walls into Watling Street. Go past the bus station on your right and the Whitefriars multi-storey car park is straight ahead and right at the mini-roundabout. If coming from the south go down the Old Dover rd and straight across the roundabout through the city walls.

### **By foot / BUS**

Between the Bus Station and Whitefriars center there is an alleyway between Boots and Next. Here there is an entrance to the car park. Go to the first floor by lift and turn left out of the lift through double doors. The management suite is 20 yds along this corridor.

## **Report on Brogdale Apple festival**

The festival went very well for us even the wet Sunday. Our stall was nearly always full of people and those members who came out did an excellent job in talking about bees and beekeeping and sold a great deal of honey. The observation hive was of course a good draw.

### **APIARY NOTES**



Now is time to do a final check on winter stores – If you don't have 20kg (40lb) for a full colony you should think about ensuring you add fondant early in the New Year and start liquid feed in February.

Make sure your mouse guards are on and also woodpecker protection - mesh or plastic sheets if you are in an area where they are present.

If you should find that your colonies at this time of year have a high varroa count especially if there are signs of viral infections then it is probably better to treat now rather than wait to treat with oxalic or lactic acid in the broodless period in Dec/Jan. The only effective method is Apistan or Bayvarol which will penetrate brood cappings to reach the mites inside. Many mites have resistance now but if the beekeepers in the area you are in have not used it for several years the resistance will have dropped and they will be effective again. However I advise all of you to only use it when no other choice is available to preserve its effectiveness.
