Dear Members,

As a Charity we have to be sure that we are able to cover all costs going forward, so it was important that we took steps to make sure that we could do that. I have to say, the delegates were very understanding and after a debate about either a

£1 increase or a £2 increase, the vote went through. So, a big thank you to each and every member.

Next year, if we have the same format, I have suggested that we have an advance practice session with the delegates speaking on the system to make sure their own equipment works satisfactorily.

We recently sent out a questionnaire regarding the BBKA News asking for your thoughts, this was in the December edition. Thinking about it now, perhaps it was not the best month for a questionnaire as everyone would have lots to do, so we have extended the date for completion by the end of February 2021.

If you have not completed the questionnaire, can I ask that you please do. This will give us an idea of what you want in your future magazines and how you prefer it to be delivered.

We have welcomed a new trustee to the Executive Committee, Jenny Morgan who has had a successful career in teaching. Jenny has been keeping bees for ten years and is a very well qualified beekeeper. I am sure she will be able to bring lots of new ideas into the BBKA. I hope you will join me in wishing her all the best in her new role as Trustee.

I would like to send a get-well message to Sarah Snelson, BBKA's Deputy Manager. You may know Sarah as she is involved with the exam systems and is one of those who regularly answers the phone if you call Stoneleigh.
